ΤΟΌΑΥ'S EDISTLE Ephesians 3: 1-13

This is the reason that I, Paul, am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles – for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given me for your benefit, and how the Mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words.

When you read this you will understand my insight into the Mystery of Christ.

In former generations this Mystery was not made known to mankind, as it has now been revealed to His holy Apostles and prophets by the Spirit, that is, the Gentiles have become fellow heirs, members of the same Body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the Gospel.

Of this Gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given me by the working of His power.

To me, the very least of all the holy ones, this grace was given to preach to the Gentiles the inscrutable riches of Christ, and to bring to light for all what is the plan of the Mystery hidden from ages past in God, Who has created all things, so that the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known through the Church to the principalities and authorities in the heavens.

This was according to the eternal purpose that He accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord, in Whom we have boldness of speech and confidence of access to God through faith in Him.

I pray therefore that you may not lose heart over my sufferings for you; they are your glory.



ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

The Christian life in charity is not a mere moral discipline, but union with the Lord Who is Spirit, 1 according to our highest faculties.²

Our "highest faculties" are the supreme human powers of intellect and will. They are what make each of us "capax Dei": with disposition to be united with the Divine. These are the powers that properly define us as human beings, distinguishing us from all the other animals in God's creation. Although some moderns think – as a caricature – that Christianity is only there to make "good little boys and girls," union with the Hidden One is the true purpose and goal of Christianity. Without union to the Divine salvation is impossible.

What is called "heaven" is simply the definitive transformation of the human person, in grace, as

participant in the Divine Nature and sharer in the divine Mystery. Contemplation in this world is thus the achieved realization of life in the presence of the Divine Loving One. "Now this is eternal life, that they should know Thee, the only true God, and Him Whom Thou hast sent, Jesus Christ."³

Salvation begins with faith, knowledge and understanding. Although the ultimate reality of God is hidden to us – even with faith – there is much that can be grasped and known. We will never have full comprehension of the divine mysteries, but that does not stop us from knowing much. We pray that God illumine the eyes of the heart⁴ that we might continually progress in knowledge and moral awareness.⁵ Morality flows from the principles and knowledge that one possesses. Illuminated by the Gospel, we live in imitation of Christ. Informed by CNN, we live in the manner of modern mass media.

When Saint Paul writes about charity, he does so less about its objects – the lovable things – than its Source. He considers first of all the love which comes from God and from Christ, and only subsequently the good things that grace does within us. Note that this is not a speculative or purely dry grasp of some historical facts, but is fundamentally a development of *experiential* knowledge of present realities. The deepening participation in divine charity refines the faculties of discernment and spiritual perception. This is the reason prayer must hold a central place in our lives; it is the only path, other than the divine Mysteries, through which the Hidden One can draw us into His light. Healed and elevated by grace, a loving heart is both *delicate* and *lucid*.

Delicate in perception and lucid in clarity of thought, the human spirit is transformed as it progresses on the path of supernatural love. Charity "senses instinctively" whatever might be pleasing or displeasing to God.⁶ Charity appreciates and "experiences" all the riches of salvation, especially that which pertains to the love of Christ. These two things cannot be separated or dissociated. It is an illusion to think one can attain God by some natural and merely meditative technique, as this would be dissociation from the personal love expressed in revelation by grace. Vague, objectless "love" degenerates into mere sentiment and "feelings,"

utterly useless without the anchor of the supreme example of the Messiah, Immanuel, "God-with-us." This is the central and supreme epiphany of the divine love among God's People.

God has spoken in time so that we might learn from His manifest example and word. Heart and mind, both are essential on the road to salvation. Philosophical consideration may be brilliant, but it does not sanctify. On its own, it is not contemplation. Altruistic behavior may be rewarding in itself, but it remains locked in this world without the inspiration and motivation in Christ. Mind and human heart reintegrated in the Divine Spirit, revolve habitually around the light of the Sacred Heart, and it is this that allows for a Christified understanding and action in human life.

Divine grace allows us to know so that we might love, and in loving we come to better understand. That deepened understanding in turn draws us further into a profounder love, and in such an expanding spiral all is meant to proceed until the Great Dawn rises before all minds and spirits on the Last Day, when all shall be made manifest before the Throne of Justice and Light.
