TDIS ÓAY'S EDISTLE¹ II Corinthians 11: 21-30

I now talk as if I were in shame; I am talking as if I were debilitated by my lack of sense, since I am being as reckless as anyone could be.

They are Hebrews, so am I.

They are Israelites, so am I.

If Abraham is their ancestor, he is mine, also. If they are servants of the Messiah (I now speak without any sense) well, I am greater than they are. I have worked harder, been subject to more violence, been imprisoned more often, and have been killed more times that they have.

I have been in danger in cities and in danger in deserts, in danger at sea, and in danger from false brothers – through hard work and tiredness, through plenty of sleeplessness through hunger and thirst, often going without food, cold, and unclothed.

Then there are all the other problems: The crowd of people that is constantly around me, and all my worries on behalf of all the churches.

Who has been made weak, if not I? Who has been offended, and am I not enflamed? If one must boast, then I will boast of my weakness.

God, the Father of our Lord *Yeshua Msheeho* – blessed be He forever and ever – knows that I am not lying.

ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

As a parish, we try to move forward, adapting always to the path laid out by Providence. Individually, we pray for light and wisdom to see the path ahead for our personal lives, but all things are to be put at the service of the Most Holy.

We would like to restore the **Sunday Vigil Mass** on Saturday evening, but this will take a bit of effort on the part of all.

The Vigil Mass was cancelled at the beginning of the pandemic as it was not possible to assure the disinfecting and cleaning of the church that would be needed in a twenty-four-hour period. Most of our faithful are in the demographic most affected by this virus, so they have been encouraged to remain at home and take precautions. We are a tiny community, also, and the manpower simply has not been there.

So, now we look for about a dozen people of good will and generous heart who may be able to commit themselves to the expansion of the liturgical schedule. Ideally, we would like to establish **three or four teams** of *three individuals* who can commit themselves to disinfect the pews *after each Saturday evening Vigil Mass* and then clean the bathrooms in the parish hall.

If this can be realized, then each person will only need to work once a month.

It would seem that if able, those who wish to assist at the Saturday Vigil Mass, could volunteer to form these teams as they will be there already in the evening.

Of course the disinfecting of the pews and missals will last as long as the pandemic endures, but the cleaning of the bathrooms will also need to be done from now on.

Those who wish to volunteer to form these teams can do so either by putting a note in the **collection** basket, or by notifying us through the **email** on the website, or, finally, by simply phoning and leaving a **message** that you would like to generously assist your fellow parishioners.

Please remember, as written up these several weeks in the protocols, that those who may be retired or freer in their week-day schedules to consider assisting at Mass during the week, freeing up space for those who are not as free, but who must work during the weekdays and thus only have Sunday as an option to come to Mass.

And may God bless every one of you for the generous, charitable, and kind efforts with which you are helping one another weather this pandemic storm. May the celestial watchers enlighten your paths and lift you into the light of the Sacred Heart!

The Life-giving Cross

Please, kindly take notice of our present practices:

- 1.) All Catholics, of whatever Ritual Church, are more than welcome at Saint Joseph. We are all one Body of Christ.
- 2.) During this pandemic, there is no obligation to assist at the Divine Sacrifice.
- 3.) Those who are sick, or carry symptoms of sickness, must remain at home.
- 4.) All are recommended to give contact information (a list is provided at the door) in order to inform you if need arise from a case of the virus. All information remains *confidential* to the *parish* and is not transferred to any state agency.
- 5.) All vulnerable, elderly, and at-risk individuals should remain at home and follow the Liturgies as posted on the parish's website.
- 6.) The **Saturday Vigil** Masses are <u>cancelled</u> until further notice.
- 7.) The **weekday Masses** have been moved into the main church to easily allow for "physical distancing" among the pews.
- 8.) All who are retired, or who may have a freer weekday schedule, are asked to consider assisting at Mass during the weekdays, **Tues-Fri**, **9:00am**; and on **Saturday at 10:00am**. This would free up more room on Sunday for those who must work during the normal workweek.
- 9.) Please remember in all this that the apostolic work of Saint Joseph must be sustained. Contributions to the parish may be made by mail, parish website, and by regular bank transfers.

- 10.) Please *do not use your hands* to cover sneezes and coughs. Everyone must have a *hand-kerchief*, tissues, or face-mask to safely control and cover all coughs, sneezes, congestion, etc. 11.) Hand sanitizers are available at the
- 11.) Hand sanitizers are available at the entrances and at the confessional.
- 12.) Arrivals at church must be "first-come-first-served". These also have the first choice of where they wish to sit.
- 13.) Everyone must sit in such a way that there is *no one immediately in front* of them and *no one immediately behind* them. Kindly follow the directions given by those trying to usher.
- 14.) Everyone will need to *charitably assist* one another to sit throughout the entire church, occupying *all* pews and spaces available with "physical distancing".
- 15.) To control crowd flow, **doors** will be **locked** at the beginning of each Liturgy, and this for the foreseeable future.
- 16.) A *six-foot distancing* must continue to be observed by those who approach the Divine Altar and wish to receive the Most Holy Eucharist in **Communion**.
- 17.) And, lastly, at the end of Mass, those who wish **to remain and pray** in the church are welcome to do so, but all others are asked *not to linger and visit within the church*. If one wishes to visit, please do so outside the church, being *mindful of the proper physical distancing*.

God bless everyone for making these efforts and being charitably attentive in how we present ourselves together before the Hidden Good One.





The popular awareness and knowledge of Saint Sharbel are significantly wider these days than they were in the years when Msgr. Eid first put pen to paper in order to present the holy hermit to the English-speaking world, but his work remains the best introduction in print.
