

#### This Oay's Edistle I Corinthians 15: 19-34

If we hope in the Messiah only in this life, then we are the most pitiable of men, but as it is, the Messiah has risen from the house of the dead, the First-Fruits of those who have died.

For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead has also come through

a Man; for as all die in Adam, so all live in the Messiah.

This will take place for each in his turn: the Messiah as the First-Fruits, and after that, when He comes, those who are in the Messiah. Then comes the end, when He hands over the Kingdom to God the Father, after He has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power.

For He will rule until He has placed all His enemies beneath His feet, and the final enemy to be destroyed shall be death.

For He has subjected everything under His feet, but when it says, "all things are put in subjection," it is plain that this does not include the One Who put all things in subjection under Him.

When everything has been subjected to Him, then even the Son shall be subjected to Him Who caused all things to be subjected to the Son, so that God shall become all in all. If this were not so, what are they doing who are baptized for the dead? If the dead do not rise, why be baptized for the dead? And why are we constantly putting ourselves in danger?

This I swear on your own boastfulness - which I make in Jesus Messiah - that I die daily. If the dead do not rise, then what did I gain by being thrown to the wild animals in Ephesus? Let us just eat and drink as we shall die tomorrow!

Do not be deceived, sordid speech corrupts healthy intentions.

Wake up to do what is right, and do not sin! There are some who do not know God, and this I say to your shame.

#### **ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS**

Today we violate taboos; we will use the public forum for a private good, but, in truth, a private good that touches us all. We render thanks to the Good One for the life and health of the parish's beloved sitoo: Dame Marie Fefa Deeb, DSG.

Today is the anniversary of Dame Marie's entrance into the world - a second taboo violated<sup>3</sup> - ninetyfive years ago. Happy Birthday!!!

Fefa is the living archive of the parish and, having been born two years before the parish's founding, its living memory.

There is little in the parish's life that at one time or another has not involved Dame Fefa. Still directing the choir, she remains the voice of our reposed immigrants, rendering the beauty of the Syriac and Arabic hymns in living blessedness.

Professor emerita of Economics, she has been central to the financial management and well-being of the community, and to this day she arrives each week to work with others to count collections, record accounts, pay bills, and file statements.

Dame Marie's life brings us full circle. At the end of the first quarter of the twentieth century, when she was born, there was no liturgical home for the Maronites in Waterville and they received hospitality among the Latin Catholics at the church of the Sacred Heart. Fefa was baptized in the parish church of the Sacred Heart. Now, almost a century later,4 she has lived to see the beauty of the Maronites reciprocating that original hospitality. In this midst of this present global crisis, Saint Joseph Antiochene Syriac Maronite Catholic Church has become a place of refuge and hospitality to many of our Latin brethren. Her parents and the original immigrants would be proud that the community they founded has become a place of refuge and a harbor of salvation to others.

May the light and beauty of Antioch as found in Beit Maroun radiate outward for many years to come!

Enjoy them, pray for Dame Marie, render thanks to the Lord God for all the good He is accomplishing among us and that He wishes to do here in this parish and in the state of Maine, and, finally, ask for the grace that we all might be faithful and fit instruments for His glory – and may each of us do so *for a century!*<sup>5</sup>

Fefa may not *do* everything in the parish, but she has been *central to its life* for many decades. May the God of all consolation grant her an abundance of grace and blessings, good health, well-being, *shlomoh*, and many years to come.

## The Life-giving Cross

Please, take notice of our present protocols:

- 1.) All Catholics, of whatever Ritual Church, are more than welcome at Saint Joseph. We are all one Body of Christ.
- 2.) During this pandemic, there is no obligation to assist at the Divine Sacrifice.

3.) Those who are sick, or carry symptoms of sickness must remain at home

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  4.) All are recommended to give contact information (a list is provided at the door) in order to inform you if need arise from a case of the virus. All information remains *confidential* to the *parish* and is not transferred to any state agency.
- 5.) All vulnerable, elderly, and at-risk individuals should remain at home and follow the Liturgies as posted on the parish's website.
- 6.) The **Sunday Vigil** Masses are <u>suspended</u> until further notice.
- 7.) All who are retired, or who may have a freer weekday schedule, are asked to consider assisting at Mass during the weekdays, **Tues-Fri**, **9:00am**; and on **Saturday at 10:00am**. This would free up more room on Sunday for those who must work during the normal workweek.
- 8.) Please *do not use your hands* to cover sneezes and coughs. Everyone must wear a **face-mask** to safely control and cover all coughs, sneezes, congestion, etc.
- 9.) Hand sanitizers are available at the entrances and at the confessional.
- 10.) Seating at church must be "first-come-first-served". Seating will be closed at "50".
- 11.) Everyone must sit in such a way that there is *no one immediately in front* of them and *no one immediately behind* them. The pews have been blocked off for this purpose.
- 12.) Everyone will need to *charitably assist* one another to sit throughout the entire church, occupying *all* pews while respecting "physical distancing".
- 13.) To control crowd flow, **doors** will be **locked** at the beginning of each Liturgy.
- 14.) A *six-foot distancing* must be observed by those who approach the Divine Altar and wish to receive the Divine Eucharist in **Holy Communion**.
- 15.) And, lastly, at the end of Mass, those who wish **to remain and pray** in the church are welcome to do so, but all others are asked *not to linger and visit within the church*. Please <u>exit through the Appleton Street</u> doorway. If one wishes to visit, please do so outside the church, being *mindful of the proper physical distancing*.
