THIS DAY'S GOSPEL: St. Matthew 24; 1-14

Jesus left the Temple and was going away, when His disciples came to point out to Him the buildings of the Temple. But He answered them, "You see all these, do you not? Amen, I say to you, there will not be left here one stone upon another, that will not be thrown down."

As He sat on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to Him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign of Your coming and of the close of the age?"

And Jesus answered them, "Take heed that no one leads you astray. For many will come in My Names, saying, 'I am the Messiah,' and they will lead many astray. And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars; see that you are not alarmed; for this must take place, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places: all this is but the beginning of the sufferings.

Then they will deliver you up to tribulation, and put you to death; and you will be hated by all nations for My Name's sake.

And then many shall fallaway, and betray one another, and hate one another. And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray. And because wickedness is multiplied, most men's love shall grow cold. But he who endures to the end will be saved.

And this Gospel of the Kingdom shall be preached throughout the whole world, as a testimony to all nations; and then the end will come.

ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

Just under forty years following Our Lord's Ascension into Heaven, the Holy Temple of God in Jerusalem was destroyed. The Temple of Herod that had taken almost fifty years to build up to the time of our Lord's apostolate was laid waste in AD 70. A the time of the destruction, the Jewish people had been in rebellion against the Roman Empire for years; the obliteration of Jerusalem was the final act in the long-drawn-out drama that had been their pursuit of political freedom. Although the Roman authorities had ordered that the temple complex be preserved for the sake of its architectural and artistic beauty, it was nevertheless destroyed completely in the fury and hatred that resulted from so many years of fighting against rebellion and insurrection. The only thing remaining to this day is the so-called "Wailing Wall," and that is not even a part of the actual temple; it is only one of the retaining walls of the esplanade above that once supported the temple. Subsequently, the Jews were expelled from the city, forbidden to return, and the place of the temple was destroyed.

It has never been rebuilt.

Jerusalem was renamed *Aelia Capitolina* by the Romans and refashioned as a thoroughly pagan city. On top of the ruins of the Temple, a pagan temple dedicated to Jupiter was constructed. It is interesting to note that to the Romans saw the Christians as simply another sect of the Jews, thus over the place of the Tomb of Our Lord's Resurrection they also destroyed the existing memorial and erected a temple dedicated to Adonis. While this was a devastating result for the Jewish people, the Christians for the most part were already gone from the Holy City following years of persecution by the Jews who had not accepted Jesus as the Messiah, and, of course, by the fact that they had heeded Our Lord's prophecy that Jerusalem

and its temple would be destroyed. This is today's Gospel reading.

As an aside, the building of the temple of Adonis is the reason that we are completely certain of the placement of Our Lord's Tomb: this temple stood there for two and a half centuries unwittingly marking the place. The mother of Constantine, Saint Helena, merely had to return to the city empowered by the authority of her imperial son and have the pagan temple razed. To this day parts of the Church of the Holy Sepulcher include sections of this structure.

As events have played out over the centuries, and most especially today, the Jews wish to rebuild the temple – two thousand years later. For the Fathers of the Church, nevertheless, the construction of this building will be one of the signs of the advent of the Anti-Christ and the coming Day of Judgment, the end of time, the *Day of the Lord*.

In the Gospel, our Lord responds to the Apostles glorying in the Temple of Herod by foretelling its doom that "no stone should be left upon a stone." They are dumbfounded by His reply. When they ask about when this will all take place they link it to the return of the Son of Man. Our Lord thus speaks simultaneously of both His Return at the end of time and the impending destruction of Jerusalem. They are, in a sense, both the same. There are in fact three things involved here: 1.) the destruction of Jerusalem; 2.) the return of the Son of Man in judgment; and, 3.) the end of the world and the initiation of the "new heaven and new earth". 1 At first these three things may seem unrelated, at least not directly, but they do all possess one quality: they exist only for a purpose. In our Lord's reply these three realities are telescoped as it were.

The Temple in Jerusalem existed to receive the Messiah.² This was accomplished when our divine Lord was presented there forty days after His glorious birth. He of course returns there numerous times during His lifetime. The Church exists to receive all those predestined to eternal glory, the children of God who are to be gathered into the vision of the Hidden One,³ that is, those who are called the "elect".⁴ Lastly, all creation was

brought into existence for the sake of God's glory. It is an manifestation of His Goodness. So it is that when each of these three realities fulfills its *raison d'être* and serves it purpose it will no longer be of use and will be brought to an end.

Thus the telescoping of events:

- a.) the *temple* will now be destroyed because the Christ has arrived;
- b.) the divine Savior will return in glory and *justice* when the last of the elect has been born into the world; and,
- c.) all creation itself will be "rolled up"⁵ and "dissolved by fire"⁶ as an end is brought to its natural state and it enters into the eternal transformation of the New Heaven and New Earth: the descent of the perfect *Eternal Jerusalem*" from the Compassionate One.

What was initiated in goodness many, many centuries ago, presently being healed and restored in mercy, will be perfected and purified in justice bringing an end to this age.

So it is, that the liturgical season of the Holy Cross is dedicated to consideration of the end-times and the eschatological truths of creation, and our individual lives within that reality. We now have seven weeks to consider goodness, mercy, justice, time, the shortness of life, death, heaven, purgation and damnation, and how these things come to influence and transform each individual human life.

Whether we wish it or not, we are actors all in this true drama. May the Compassionate One strengthen us in all our endeavors toward His honor and glory.
