

But then, hope that is seen is not hope. For if it is seen then what would there be to wait for? For if we hope for something we cannot see, then we wait with expectation.

Likewise, the Spirit also helps our weaknesses. We do not know for what we ought to pray, but the Spirit prays instead of us, using inexpressible sighs.

And then He who scrutinizes the heart knows what the Spirit thinks because when He prays within the saints, He does so in accordance with God's will.

#### **ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS**

Our new Sunday schedule will take some time to get used to – for all of us. May we all accept it as a "cross", which, by definition, is life-giving. May the light of the Resurrection strengthen us all at this time and fortify our charity in illuminated hope.

In previous bulletins I have mentioned that it would be a good use of the present time – during

this pandemic "slowdown" – to read again the Catholic Catechism, to re-inform and develop our knowledge of the Faith. Refresh and re-invigorate is our intent, but now, as we consider the life and work of Saint Ephraim, there is an added value. While reading the words of the Catechism we can better appreciate how much sacrifice, fidelity, strenuous effort, and even blood has been poured out so that we might easily arrive at such a beautiful, profound, and accurate expression of the healing revelation of the Hidden God of mercy.

A gentleman said to me a couple years ago that his greatest revelation at university had been when he came to understand that *there is a reason for each thing as it is taught by the Church*. She is the Divine Spouse and Body of Christ, her loyalty is indefectible. He had been ignorant of that fact in his adolescence, and its discovery had been transformative to his life, and so it is now to the life of his family.

Thinking of the value of human words – their possible precision and their shocking insufficiency at times – we can better appreciate how much this doctrinal expression has cost over the centuries in time, in strife, in conflict, always in an effort to hammer out, articulate, verbalize, and formulate the clarity of the Apostolic Faith.

The Faith is a pure gift, but its human communication involves human minds. The vocabulary, the definitions, the very words chosen with precise forethought, have all cost many men and women a great deal as the centuries rolled on so that we might be heirs of such an extraordinary and beautiful heritage. Sadly, we overlook this fact, and too often fail to appreciate our ancestors; we too easily take our *catechesis* for granted. Worse, many simply reject it out of hand and cast it aside. Having failed to perceive its light, they march forward into darkness.

He who hears you, hears Me; he who rejects you rejects Me, and he who rejects Me rejects Him Who sent Me.<sup>3</sup>

Our Catechism is nothing less than of the voice of Christ and the unique path to salvation.

This centuries-long fidelity is our gain, and their faith is our faith, handed down to us from the Apostles. Their loyalty to the Lord God preserved the Message originating in the Word Incarnate and handed on to us to this day. How do we personally receive this word, this Message; how do we grapple with it, and transmit it to others?

Are we faithful links in an unbroken apostolic chain, or do we risk breaking off that line, and disconnecting those who will come after us? Our fidelity is the present link that assures salvation transmitted to the twenty-second century.

Refresh the spirit and the mind in the faithful teachings of the Fathers, ponder their writings and reflect on their words. Pray in their spirit and be nourished in their gracious strength. It should be our honor to be called to walk in the footsteps of loyal men such as Saint Athanasius and Saint Ephraim.

Words matter, and when they reflect divine revelation in grace they bring us to intimacy with the unique Life-giving Source of Salvation. How have we received, and how do we communicate that luminous verbal path?



# The Life-giving Cross

#### Please, take notice of our present protocols:

- 1.) All Catholics, of whatever Ritual Church, are more than welcome at Saint Joseph. We are all one Body of Christ.
- 2.) During this pandemic, there is no obligation to assist at the Divine Sacrifice.

- 3.) Those who are sick, or carry symptoms of sickness must remain at home
- sickness, must remain at home.
  4.) All are recommended to give contact information (a list is provided at the door) in order to inform you if need arise from a case of the virus. All information remains *confidential* to the *parish* and is not transferred to any state agency.
- 5.) All vulnerable, elderly, and at-risk individuals should remain at home and follow the Liturgies as posted on the parish's website.
- 6.) The **Sunday Vigil** Masses are <u>suspended</u> until further notice.
- 7.) All who are retired, or who may have a freer weekday schedule, are asked to consider assisting at Mass during the weekdays, **Tues-Fri**, **9:00am**; and on **Saturday at 10:00am**. This would free up more room on Sunday for those who must work during the normal workweek.
- 8.) Please *do not use your hands* to cover sneezes and coughs. Everyone must wear a **face-mask** to safely control and cover all coughs, sneezes, congestion, etc.
- 9.) Hand sanitizers are available at the entrances and at the confessional.
- 10.) Seating at church must be "*first-come-first-served*". Seating will be closed at "50".
- 11.) Everyone must sit in such a way that there is *no one immediately in front* of them and *no one immediately behind* them. The pews have been blocked off for this purpose.
- 12.) Everyone will need to *charitably assist* one another to sit throughout the entire church, occupying *all* pews while respecting "physical distancing".
- 13.) To control crowd flow, **doors** will be **locked** at the beginning of each Liturgy.
- 14.) A *six-foot distancing* must be observed by those who approach the Divine Altar and wish to receive the Divine Eucharist in **Holy Communion**.
- 15.) And, lastly, at the end of Mass, those who wish **to remain and pray** in the church are welcome to do so, but all others are asked *not to linger and visit within the church*. Please <u>exit through the Appleton Street</u> doorway. If one wishes to visit, please do so outside the church, being *mindful of the proper physical distancing*.
