

Examine yourselves to see whether you are living in faith.

Test yourselves.

Do you not realize that Jesus Christ is within you? – unless, of course, you fail this test.

I hope you will discover that we have not failed. But we pray to God that you may not do evil, not that we may appear to have passed the test, but that you may do what is right, even though we may seem to have failed.

For we cannot do anything against the truth, but only for the truth.

For we rejoice when we are weak and you are strong. This is what we pray for that you may become perfect.

So I write these things while I am away from you, so that when I come I may not have to be severe in using the authority that the Lord has given me to build up and not to tear down.

Finally, brethren, rejoice. Put things in order, listen to my appeal, encourage one another, live in peace. And may the God of charity and peace be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss.

All the holy ones greet you.

The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.



ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

The good news, "the Gospel", is the gift of God.

It is a grace, that is, it is not a moral assistance
contributed by God to our human liberty
in order to render our acts meritorious of eternal life.
Grace is the physical communication of Divine Life:
God begets us and we are truly made His children¹.²

Christianity is not primarily about individuals, nor is it focus on "getting souls to heaven". The Gospel is not a self-help manual on "how to be good". Grace is, as quoted above, the physical communication of Divine Life, so Christianity, as divine life introduced into the world, is the advent of a new order of things.

Grace is not something that merely "polishes up" the world and makes it more respectable. Grace and the Gospel enter a wounded world so that it can be made whole. The Gospel reveals the entrance of a new creation and the transformation of life. Again, as quoted above, the Gospel is the announcement of the Good One's intent to make anew and generate each individual as His "child" – a reflection and extension of His life and His love. When we live this new reality, salvation is ours.

This is why, at the end of his letter to the Corinthians, Saint Paul can write that the Christians "test" themselves. "Examine yourselves to see whether you are living in faith." To have heard the catechism, know, more or less, the "Jesus Story", and think vaguely and confusedly about what it is to be "Maronite" is *insufficient*. We must embrace the Gospel, open our minds to the Light that is Christ, and collaborate with the transforming action of the Spirit of Holiness as He works within our spirit. Anything less than this is insufficient. As they say, "almost" works only in horseshoes and atomic

bombs, it won't get us into the fullness of the Kingdom.

The "test" is simple: we each ask ourselves, "does my life manifest the Lord Jesus living within me?" This is not a question of whether I am a "good person" – no one thinks himself bad. So, in other words, do those around me see clearly the new creation at work within me? Do my words, my actions, and my life *as a whole* manifest the Face of Christ? If not, why not? Are we afraid to go counter-current, stand out in the crowd? Should this be the case, we are guaranteed of being overwhelmed by the inundation of tangled corruption that presently confuses and drowns the world around us – it may even now be drowning us unawares. Lent is a call to awaken.

We must see the wounded world around us for what it is, and judge correctly its perpetual emptiness and insufficiency to give life. Truth is the correspondence between mind and reality, and ultimate Reality is Hidden Eternal Love. Truth compels us to examine and see – and judge – or we risk being satisfied with the misalignment of spiritual psychosis.

The importance of "the test" is that is shows whether we see the Plan of God and the beauty of the New Creation at work in our lives, or not. Grace communicates divine life and in this communion the Hidden One desires to renew in each of us His perfect image and likeness. The purpose of the Christian life is to enter more and more deeply into the unchanging eternal Light that is God. Freely we have received, freely we must give in turn.

This Gospel is not a generic theory about "the human race" or "humanity". It is addressed to each individual in his freedom. Each of us is either saved in grace-filled radiant *shlomoh*, or, left to our own nature alone, lost in the dark confusion of our insufficiency.

Bishop Gregory has asked all the parishes to put notice in our bulletins of a new film coming out this weekend. It covers the experience of one of the principal directors in Planned Parenthood who came to understand that the "fetus" is as much a baby as the one you have carried in your arms.

Although the drama that surrounds an unexpected pregnancy can be horrendous, and the circumstances warrant individual considerations and serious application to correct socially and financially – and for all these corrections to be inspired by supernatural faith and charity – we also know from the writings of Saint Paul that God's revelation clarifies the great philosophical question about goals: the "end does <u>not</u> justify the means".³ Situations are not more important than an innocent human life.

This movie, **UNPLANNED**, is the inspiring true story of one woman's journey of transformation. All Abby Johnson ever wanted to do was help women. As one of the youngest Planned Parenthood clinic directors in the nation, she was involved thousands of abortions. Her passion surrounding a woman's "right to choose" even led her to become a spokesperson for Planned Parenthood, fighting to enact legislation for the cause she so deeply believed in until the day she saw something that changed everything, leading her to join her former enemies at 40 Days-For-Life, and become one of the most ardent pro-life speakers in America.

In consideration of the grave difficulties surrounding "'unwanted' pregnancy", such as the collapse of family and loss of communal structures that once supported the healthy entrance of babies into the world, we must ever repeat: the baby in question is not the central "problem" and its destruction is not an acceptable "solution". The "termination" of a baby *in utero* is intrinsically evil, completely

unacceptable, and a perverse means toward what would necessarily become a questionable end.

As some seem confused about this, it is essential to repeat that abortion, the deliberate killing of an unborn children, is *gravely sinful* and remains even today a sin that is cause for *excommunication* from the Church.

Excommunication means that the guilty person is severed from the life of the Catholic Church and can no longer receive the Sacraments or its intercessions until such time as the sin is confessed, properly absolved, and penance is received.

Grave turmoil weighing on the parents -- whether of familial collapse, poverty, health, or the inability to rear this specific child - are all *settings* surrounding the life of the child in question. They are *circumstances*, and as such they do not outweigh the intrinsic value of a human life. The considerations may be serious, and they should be dealt with in charitable and fitting ways, but the death of an innocent can *never* be chosen as means to an end.

All of us should be clear on the gravity of this sin, and the severe penalty imposed on it by the

Church. One *cannot in good conscience* be both a good Christian and *support the killing* of the unborn. A Catholic cannot be what is called "pro-choice".

Specifics for the Great fast

as directed by the Patriarch

- A.) Ash Monday and Great and Holy Friday of the Crucifixion are obligatory days of Days of Fast and Abstinence for all 18-60.
- B.) All from the age of reason onward are obliged to follow the abstinence from all meat products on these fast days even if they are strictly not obliged to fast. On all other weekdays, Monday-Friday, one is encouraged to observe the ancient traditions and fasts.
- C.) All Fridays are required days of abstinence from all meat and animal products.

QUANTITY: In our tradition, the fast means no food whatsoever between midnight and noon, only water and medication are permitted. Following noon, only one meal proper is eaten within the next twelve hours, although a second "collation", a "snack", during the remaining time is permitted to sustain strength (this is the equivalent of about two/three ounces of food).

QUALITY: Also, in our eastern tradition, the days of fast are in practice vegan, that is, no animal products, no meat, no seafood, no meat products, no dairy, no eggs, nor dairy products are to be eaten.
