THIS DAY'S GOSPEL St. Luke 2; 41-52

Now His parents went to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover.

And when He was twelve years old, they went up according to custom; and when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed

behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it, but supposing Him to be in the company they went a day's journey, and they sought Him among their kinsfolk and acquaintances; and when they did not find Him, they returned to Jerusalem, seeking Him. After three days they found Him in the Temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and

asking them questions. And all who heard Him were amazed at His understanding and His answers.

And when they saw Him they were astonished; and His Mother said to Him, "Son, why have You treated us so? Behold, Your father and I have been looking for You anxiously."

And He said to them, "How is it that you sought Me? Did you not know that I must be about My Father's business?"

And they did not understand the saying that He spoke to them.

And He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them.

And His Mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature, and in favor with God and man.



ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

Praise to the Hidden Son, the One Who has come to restore us to Life

At first glance surprising, there is obscurity and silence on the path of grace. It is noteworthy that the angelic glory on the night of Divine Wisdom's birth is for the shepherds in the fields; it is not for Mary and Joseph. The Hidden One leaves these two in the contemplative silence of the animals' cave. Those closest to the Word Incarnate do not receive the added fanfare of the angelic hosts. They are left in contemplative silence.

As the Child Jesus grew and matured in Nazareth, He was faithful in all that pertained to the ancient Law – imitating the fidelity shown by His parents, Mary and Joseph. Nevertheless, as He came of age and recognized as a "son of the Law," in His "bar mitzvah," He lead the holy parents of Nazareth into further obscurity by remaining behind in Jerusalem. Three days He left them in anxious search. We can note here that He did this intentionally.

Even as He grew and matured in His sacred humanity, as the Divine Word (the Hidden Son of the Hidden Father) He led those closest to Him, those most intimate to the Divine Mystery of the Incarnation, into a darkness that certainly tried and pained them. This is mysterious, but it is an excellent lesson. It is precisely as we mature in the faith, and progress on the paths of God that we are guided more and more profoundly into silence and mystery.

When we begin in the path of the Gospel, God leads us as it were with "sweets." Much as children can only be gotten to follow directions by promises of "goodies" at the end, so God must lead His immature children by the consolations and "nifs"1 that so many seek. On the other hand, for those who progress on the path of spiritual maturity, the Hidden Lord conducts His disciples onto the obscure path of silent grace and hidden mystery. This is the profound lesson that today's Gospel set before our eyes. As grown men and women do not need to be constantly promised "goodies" in order to get them to do what is their duty and responsibility, so it is that consolations and "spiritual candy" are removed from the maturing followers of Christ.

"How is it that you sought Me?," asks Our Lord of all His disciples, not just of His parents. This query examines whether we seek the Lord for His glory and honor, or whether we seek Him for something we *get from* Him. It asks if we are disciples or mercenaries? Do we wish to imitate the Crucified One or do we seek primarily our own liking?

This question we can answer when we know what it is that we look for both in life and from the Gospel. If we seek the Lord God, we are content to be guided on a path that is at times dark, silent and obscure, seeking the One Whom we will find "in the Temple." If we seek firstly ourselves, we struggle with difficulties and are displeased by adversity – we do not see a higher cause or purpose than our own pleasure; we chafe under the Hand of God if things are not laid out as we wish. In this we show ourselves to be immature in the ways of God, and children in selfish pursuit of our own benefits.

We should pray that the Hidden Wisdom create within each of us a tranquil heart that yearns for the revelation of grace and divine charity in our lives (never troubled by the possibly obscure path of divine mystery) – and a peaceful spirit that patiently accepts to be taught along the paths that God lays out for each in His love and as He sees fit. After all, the humble and pure of heart know that there is much to learn.

"How is it that you sought Me?"

May this new year of grace be filled with God's choicest blessings – either luminous or obscure – for you and your families all throughout the coming months!

These blessings can take place from January 6th – the actual feastday – through the second half of January.


