TOΌλΥ'S GOSPEL¹ St. John 14: 21-27

ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

Love is a mystery in many ways. We don't know what we don't know. Only when we know someone can we "fall in love". The young lady who works down the hall is just another woman until you meet her. One has to know someone in order to love him.

Ignorance never fosters love, which is why ignorance never fosters holiness. Hence, Our Lord can say that *if* you love Me you will listen and follow My directives.

There can be no knowledge of the divine without a relation between the knower and God. In natural knowledge – what the human mind can know by its purely natural intellectual powers – the Origin of all things, the Creator, can be known *indirectly*, that is, through the things that exist around us, one can reason to, and know through *causality*, that there is a God; but a natural knowledge of God is not love for Him. Neither Aristotle nor Socrates ever erected a temple dedicated to the Origin of All, the First Unmoved Mover, or Transcendent Beauty.

As we considered last Sunday: hearing, presence, listening, and *reciprocated* communication are all necessary for love to flourish – whether that love be human or divine. But in the latter case, it must also be a question of "grace": the knowledge of the Hidden One Who wishes to be known. As God is transcendent and infinitely distant in every way from us, this knowledge and charity must begin with Him. He must choose to reveal Himself to one who is disposed to see and love. (Note that this disposition is also His work.)

This is a great mystery: all originates in God, He has invited all to His love and charity, He has disposed all in one way or another to seek Him, but has

revealed Himself only to those who choose freely to respond in order to know and love. This exceeds our understanding because these fundamental things all lie within the sovereign will of the Hidden Divinity, and within the unique free-will and mind of each man. Both realities escape our direct experience, and are thus fundamentally unknowable.

Presence to the beloved is key. Knowledge gives us reasons to love, but it is in being present that charity flourishes. Knowledge may draw us to the beloved, but it is only reciprocated communication that engenders love. We love because we have discovered the goodness in another, and the more we know the other the more likely we are to love. The more we know of the goodness of another, the more we are drawn further into love, and deepening love makes us desire to know more of the loved one. Love and knowledge turn around one another. As the Anaphoras state, "those who are far" necessarily grow cold in their love of God because they neglect the eternal goodness and lovableness of the Hidden Good One by their absence. Camp may be lovely at this time of year, but camp will never bring us into the presence of the Divine Kingdom. The farther we are from the Divine Mysteries, the farther we wander from the God of Salvation.

We must remember that the Church is "expansionist" in her existence. She is meant to radiate out from the morning of the Resurrection to all the peoples of the earth. When that life is not fruitful – being communicated through us to others – it will often die even in the first possessor of the life of grace. As the Fathers wrote, there are no plateaus in the Christian life and so there none either for the Church – the Body of believers. In the evening Office, *Ramsho* of Thursday, during the Sedro, we pray that the Life of Christ expand outward to others and that we who already now believe be spared from falling into false doctrine or that we leave the practice of the Faith:

Exalt Thy Church and lead her to those who are strangers, to those who remain far from Thy Mysteries, and to those who do not believe in Thee. Let there be no heresies to draw us away from Thee, and may only true faith be proclaimed in Thy Church until the end of time.

In the *Paradiso* of Dante,² Beatrice says to the Pilgrim that the knowledge of God "is buried from the eyes of everyone whose intellect has not matured within the flame of love".

Those "who are far" manifest their coldness in self-centeredness and the immaturity of their ways. All too often they chose the world and its goods over the Good Lord of all. Thus they are worldly, and by definition "far". The worldly prove their infidelity by trying to live lives where God is an addendum, and not the center of their existence as the law of charity requires. He who loves father, mother, ... or son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me.³

So let us open ourselves in daily prayer to that primordial Divine Love, which created all things in goodness, so that we might share in that eternal charity. Faithful to every Sunday, may we be assiduous to gather at the forgiving altar of the Lord on day of the Resurrection.

It is most especially in the Divine Mysteries that the Hidden One reveals His Love in Person.

The Fasc of the holy Apostles

Saints Peter and Paul (June 29th) and the Twelve Apostles (June 30th)

As we were reminded by our Patriarch in his recent Lenten Letter, it is our tradition to fast in preparation for the great feasts of Saints Peter and Paul, and all are encouraged to do so faithfully, *par*. 23:

This fast is known as "The Apostles' Fast, during which the faithful abstain from eating meat, dairy products and eggs, from **June 17**th -- 28th.

We are reminded in *paragraph 21* of the same letter that "a fast" is to go without all foods from midnight to noon, after which we abstain from all animal flesh and animal products – "vegan" as they would call it these days.

When a fast day falls on a Saturday or a Sunday (as will be the case on June 22nd and 23rd this year) one can eat as they wish, but must still

abstain from all animal flesh and animal products.

This year, there is no fast or otherwise on the Feast of the Sacred Heart, June 28th.

This binds all who have attained the age of the use of reason, par. 22.
