Rite of the Lamp

A table is prepared in the sanctuary with a crucifix and two lit candles.

On the table, there is also a "lamp" (qindil)- a ball of dough, immersed in oil, on a plate.

Seven wicks or tapers are placed in the dough. They are not lit. The incense is prepared, burning on the side. Priests and deacons assemble before the table, each vested according to his order.

Celebrant:

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

Congregation:

Amen.

Opening Prayer

Cel: O Lord God,

make us worthy, by Your divine teaching,

to bind and heal these wounds, through our tears of contrition,

which resulted from the sting of our sin.

Grant us, O Lord God,

that we may meet You with purity

and an enlightened soul,

and delight in the eternal blessings of Your Kingdom.

And we will glorify You,

together with the lambs on Your right, and give glory to You, and to Your Father,

and to Your Holy Spirit,

now and forever.

Cong: Amen.

Psalm 50 (51)

The celebrant and congregation sing or recite Psalm 50 (51):

Cel: Have mercy on me, O God,

according to Your loving kindness;

according to the multitude of Your tender mercies

blot out my sins.

Cong: Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity,

and cleanse me from my sins.

Cel: Satisfy me with Your joy and gladness,

that my broken spirit may rejoice.

Cong: Turn your face from my sins,

and blot out all my iniquities.

Cel: Create in me a clean heart, O God,

and renew a right spirit within me.

Cong: Cast me not away from Your presence;

and take not Your Spirit of holiness from me.

Cel: O Lord, open my lips,

and my mouth shall show forth Your praise.

Cong: For You desire not sacrifice;

You delight not in burnt offerings.

Cel: The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit;

a broken and contrite heart, O God, You will not despise.

All: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

now and forever. Amen.

Reading

St. James 5:13-18 The Prayer of Faith

Deacon: I read from James the Apostle of our Lord Jesus Christ,

before this holy lamp, and before our father, the priest.

Barekhmor, Aboun.

Cel: Glory to the Lord of the Apostles.

May their prayer be a wall of protection

for this city (or country),

and for all who dwell in it, forever. Amen.

Deacon: If one of you is in difficulty, let him pray; if one is cheerful, let him sing

praise.

If one among you is sick, let him call for the presbyters of the church who should then pray for him, anointing him with oil in the Name of our Lord. And the prayer of faith will heal the sick man and our Lord shall raise him up; and if that man has committed any sins, they shall be forgiven him. Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another that you may be healed, because the prayer of the just man has great power in its effects.

Eliyah was a man who was able to suffer just as we do. He prayed for there to be no rain upon the earth, and there was none for three years and six months; then he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain and the earth

yielded its fruit.

Cong: Kyrie, eleison/Lord, have mercy. (3x)

The first wick of the lamp is lit while the congregation sings or recites the Qolo.

Qolo

Tune: bnisho d'mor yacoub

Cel: O Good Shepherd,

You came to seek the lost sheep.

Call us now, O Lord,

that we may be sheep of Your flock.

Cong: O Good One,

You open Your door to the sinners. Open to us the door of Your mercy,

that we may come to You.

Cel: With the sign of Your Cross,

mark, Lord, all the members of our body

and protect them from all harm.

Do not let evil and his inclinations dominate, at will: our eyes, that they may look to You with a pure look; our ears, that they may be inclined to listen to Your Word;

our lips, that they may sing the glory of Your Name;

our breath, that it may breathe the fragrance of eternal life; our hands, that they may keep knocking at Your door;

and our feet, that they may walk upon the path

leading to the Temple of Your Divinity.

You sought the wandering sheep gone astray from the flock. Search out my perdition, as did the woman who lost her coin:

You are indeed seeking those who are lost.

I will then proclaim and say:

Blessed are You, O Lover of sinners.

as You were with Phineas and Eleazar. You were satisfied with the chanting

offered to You by Aaron,

and You removed death from the people of Israel. Now, Lord, accept the incense that we offer to You.

Blessing of Oil

The celebrant prays over the oil, saying:

Cel: O Lord God, in the abundance of Your Mercy,

You cure the infirmity of our soul and body.

Bless † this oil.

For those who are anointed with it, may it be a cure and a salvation

from all sufferings, ills, and malice;

may Your Holy Name be glorified through it.

You are our all-merciful and compassionate Savior, our Lord and God,

Iesus Christ.

To You, to Your Father, and to Your Holy Spirit

be glory and thanksgiving, forever.

Cong: We praise You; we bless You; we adore You;

we acknowledge and ask You:

have mercy on us, O Lord, and hear us.



V Invocation of the Holy Spirit

The celebrant invokes the Holy Spirit, saying:

Cel: May Your Holy and living Spirit, O Lord, come and bless this oil †.

May this oil be filled with Your power.

May Your Divinity abide in it, so it may become, in the Holy Spirit, the oil of joy-

a regenerating oil,

a consecrated oil,

an angelic shield against the power of the adversary.

May it become a joy and eternal happiness to those who believe in it,

so that it may protect those who are anointed by it.

Because it is for them the oil of a new life,

may they shine like heavenly stars,

in purity and holiness,

on the day in which the Just will radiate like the sun in the kingdom of

their Father.

With them and among them,

we will offer glory to You, forever.

Cong: Amen.

VI

The Anointing with the Facred Oil

The celebrant dips the thumb of his right hand, or a cotton swab, in the oil and starts anointing the members of the community. He marks them with the sign of the Cross on their foreheads, saying:

Cel:

For the forgiveness of your sins and faults, and for the healing of your body and soul.

Qolo

bo'outho d'mor ya'qoub

The congregation sings or recites a proper hymn of penance.

Cong:

My soul is broken and afflicted.
My soul yearns for mercy.
Come to me, Lord, tell me
to rise and serve.
Like the woman with fever,
who received Your blessing
heal my soul, Lord,
and grant me the blessing
that is from You.

You cured the sick, Lord, only by the touch of Your hand.
Now touch my soul, Lord, heal my infirmity and forgive my sins.
You are love, tender and healing love.
Tell me, Lord, to rise and serve, that I may rise and serve.

My soul sings to the One
Who healed us from our ills,
Who granted us total cure
from our sickness.
My soul sings to the Son,
our Savior and Physician,
our Healer and our All-Merciful One.
My soul sings to the Father
and to the Holy Spirit
for ages to come.
Amen.

Concluding Prayers --- Hootomoh

Cel: Kyrie, eleison/Lord, have mercy. (3x)

qadeeshat aloho; qadeeshat hayeltono; qadeeshat lo moyouto. Holy art Thou, O God; Holy art Thou, O Mighty One;

Holy art Thou, O Immortal One.

Cong: msheeHo dest-lebt Hlo fein, etraHam alayn.

O Christ who was crucified for us, have mercy on us. (3x)

Cong: Our Father . . .

Cel: O Lord our God, Jesus Christ,

You are the true Physician of our souls and bodies.

In Your Grace and in the bounty of the Father Who sent You,

heal our infirmity and our ills.

May Your mercy and compassion be upon us, Your creatures and the work of Your hand, so that we may find salvation in You, and offer glory to You, to Your Father,

and to Your Holy Spirit, forever.

Cong: Amen.
